**TITLE: RE Accreditation of Accredited Persons employed by
AP Security Ltd**

I, Chief Constable Nick Ephgrave of Surrey Police hereby continue to approve AP Security Ltd (APS) as a fit and proper organisation to employ accredited persons within the Surrey Community Safety Accreditation Scheme, in line with the provisions of Section 40 of the Police Reform Act 2002, following the approval given by my predecessor Chief Constable Lynne Owens in July 2014.

I grant continuing accreditation until 4th July 2018, subject to appropriate re vetting procedures to each of the below named as an Accredited Person (AP) as prescribed by Section 41 of the Police Reform Act 2002 and amended by the Serious Organised Crime and Police Act 2005.

The named Accredited Persons are authorised to exercise the powers detailed as follows:

- The power of a constable engaged in the regulation of traffic on a road to direct a person driving a vehicle to stop or to make it proceed in a particular line of traffic and to direct a person on foot to stop proceeding along or across the carriageway.
Paragraph 8B of Schedule 5 to the Police Reform Act 2002 (inserted by section 122 and paragraph 20 of Schedule 8 to the Serious Organised Crime and Police Act 2005).
- The power of a constable to require the name and address from a person who the accredited person has reasonable cause to believe has committed offences under Section 35 or 37 of the Road Traffic Act 1988.
Paragraph 3A of Schedule 5 to the Police Reform Act 2002 (inserted by section 122 and paragraph 19 of Schedule 8 to the Serious Organised Crime and Police Act 2005).

I am satisfied the below named have been trained and are suitable and capable persons to carry out the role of Accredited Person, employed by AP Security Ltd, within the Surrey Police area.
